COMMENTARY

We see that in order to give us entry to salvation, the Jew was covered with a veil and could not see his Messiah teaching the way to eternal life. Then, a great opportunity was given to us, so to take part in such great gift.

We are not deserving, nor do we have a right to anything, as that canaanite woman showed when she went out to ask for health for her daughter (Matthew 15:21-27). The Lord tells her that he has come to “the lost sheep of Israel”, making reference to not taking away the bread of the children and giving it to the dogs, but she answers “Yes, Lord, but the dogs eat from the crumbs that fall from the table of their masters”.

We are not receiving crumbs from God and his Christ, but rather, great loaves of bread of doctrine, and the opportunity of eternal life, even though we are not natural born of the people, but being converted into such.

Let us be thankful from our heart for this opportunity, and let us not allow it to pass by, on the contrary, we can end up with nothing if we do not take advantage of it now.
